

What is a CEU?

A CEU is a Continuing Education Unit that is required by a professional licensing body. Southface-hosted courses provide CEUs for many professions at one unit per hour.

Certificates

Continuing Education Units are recorded two ways:

- Southface reports AIA registrants.
- All others are self-reported self-reported.

At the end of each class, each participant receives a certificate of attendance outlining the number of training hours and the Training provider's name and contact information.
