




ANNUAL REPORT

I had my first encounter with Southface Institute in high school as I was just starting to explore my newfound passion for sustainability and solar energy. It was a full-circle moment for me to join this incredible organization as president decades later in 2022. As much as I'm inspired by Southface's past, my first year with this team made me even more excited about the resilient future that we are building toward every day.

Fueled by a community of dedicated supporters, Southface is helping to make utility bills more affordable for hardworking families and strengthening a national network of nonprofits through the GoodUse program. More than 545 GoodUse projects across 29 states have led to nonprofits cumulatively saving \$3.5 million in annual utility costs, with 41 new projects initiated in 2022 alone.

We're consulting with municipalities and engaging the public to set ambitious but achievable clean energy and transportation goals. We're also providing low-cost technical services and workforce training to strengthen the circular economy across Georgia, Florida's Gulf Coast, the Southeast, and beyond. Last year, we trained 343 construction industry professionals and helped launch Chattanooga's new Construction Career Center.

Together, we are convening, connecting, and growing our communities so that sustainability and resiliency work for everyone. In addition to officially intervening in regulatory proceedings in 2022, our advocacy team equipped more than 1,000 Georgians to join in calling for utility-scale investments in clean and affordable energy.

I invite you to learn more about Southface's 2022 impact in this report. Moving forward, we are **deepening our commitment to environmental justice and taking our mission to scale, especially in rural and other underserved areas.** Thank you to everyone who continues to make our collective progress possible. **Our planet and communities are counting on it.**

2022 TIMELINE



Centre Pointe Apartments - EarthCraft Multi-Family Certified

January 2022

- Georgia Power filed their 2022 Integrated Resource Plan (IRP), outlining how they plan to invest funds from their 2.7 million customers across energy sources and programs. Southface launched a series of community engagement sessions with Partnership for Southern Equity and Vote Solar three months prior.
- Our EarthCraft team certified their first multifamily affordable housing units of the year, ensuring the efficiency, air quality, and durability of 2,773 units total by 2023. They also certified 83 single-family homes and one light commercial building.

February 2022

Registration opened for our technical trainings. In 2022, we helped 343 trade workers learn building science concepts and gain certifications as EarthCraft Builders, Duct and Envelope Tightness Verifiers, HERS Raters, ENERGY STAR Homes Certifiers, and more.

March 2022

- Based out of Southface Sarasota, our first Florida advocacy lead began outreach on the state's utility regulatory process.
- In our virtual Sustainability in Action Roundtable series, experts from Brian Boggs Chairmakers and the Home Depot discussed what it means to be "Sustainably Made in America."
- We hosted Atlanta Housing and HUD User's Innovation in Affordable Housing Competition, where teams of graduate students from across the US competed to problem-solve a real-life affordable housing design issue.

April 2022

- Southface is a proud EarthShare member and tabled at their 2022 Earth Day celebration, engaging the sustainability community.
- Our Resource Center and Eco Office demonstration buildings have each earned sustainability certifications over the years. Leveraging natural ventilation methods, Southface's campus was LEED-certified as a whole for the first time.

May 2022

We welcomed James Marlow as Southface's third president in our 45-year history. James has extensive experience in solar energy, sustainability, and tech and engaged with Southface first while he was in high school.



Our EarthCraft program manager represented Southface on This Old House. The footage aired on season 44 episode 3: "School of HVAC."



Southface jointly intervened in Georgia Power's IRP with the Southern Alliance for Clean Energy (SACE). We submitted expert testimony for three witnesses, advocating for affordable clean energy and efficiency programs.

June 2022

- We held Southface's first in-person Solstice celebration since before the pandemic, welcoming the community back to our Eco Office.
- Soon after Georgia Power filed their 2022 Rate Case with the Public Service Commission, Southface and SACE filed to jointly intervene. We provided input to help determine "fair and reasonable" customer rates and charges to cover IRP investments and expenditures.



July 2022

- Southface Sarasota had to relocate from its first home after the Florida House lease ended. Turning the setback into an exciting new opportunity, Southface Sarasota forged a partnership with New College of Florida and moved onto their campus.
- Southface submitted our final brief with SACE to the Commission in the 2022 Georgia Power IRP. The stipulation was adopted with several wins for utility-scale sustainability.

August 2022

- The Inflation Reduction Act passed Congress with \$369 billion included for energy security and climate solutions—the single biggest climate investment in US history! Southface began work to leverage this unprecedented opportunity.
- We welcomed our first interns since before the pandemic: undergraduates Reed Walker (BIT Building), Kate Gordon (GoodUse), Mark McGovern (EarthCraft), and Darius Thompson (Marketing).
- Southface and Greenlink Analytics collaborated on the Athens-Clarke County Clean and Renewable Energy Plan, and it was officially adopted by the ACC Commission.
- With renovations through our GoodUse program, The SAE School achieved a perfect ENERGY STAR score.

September 2022

We reengaged our Alumni network with a gathering of current and former Southfacers sharing updates, insights, and opportunities with each other.



Southface, Greenlink Analytics, and the Center for Transportation and the Environment developed the City of Decatur Clean Energy Plan, engaging the community along the way. The plan was adopted by the Decatur City Commission.



Southface hosted an equity-focused 2022 Rate Case workshop with Partnership for Southern Equity.

October 2022

- Our 24th Visionary Dinner was held at Agnes Scott College, raising mission-critical funds. Southface has worked with the college for decades on their ambitious sustainability goals.
- At Visionary Dinner, we presented our prestigious Argon Award to Ryan Gravel, the urban designer behind the Atlanta BeltLine. Ryan credits Southface with giving the BeltLine concept its first major audience.
- Southface honored Susan Kidd with our inaugural Luminary Award and Southface Alumna Chandra Farley with our inaugural Rising Star Award for their important contributions to sustainability.



November 2022

Our GoodUse team completed their **Construction Career Center project with** the Building and Construction Workforce Center in Chattanooga, Tenn. The efficiency improvements provide ongoing utility savings that the nonprofit can invest in their students.

December 2022

- Southface and SACE submitted their final brief in the Rate Case, and stipulation was adopted. Overall, we participated in 10 regulatory proceedings and hosted and cosponsored over 20 workshops and events in 2022, empowering 1,000+ people.
- We celebrated the year's sustainability successes at our 2022 Winter Solstice event.
- Lori Whittle was named our 2022 Volunteer of the Year for spending over 1,000 hours helping Southface Sarasota move from the Florida House to the New College campus.



Spotlight on the Kendeda Fund

The Kendeda Fund supports the dignity of individuals and the sustainability of communities through investments in transformative leaders and ideas. They have been a powerful and collaborative catalyst to Southface's impact since 2007.

The Kendeda Fund was the founding partner and funder of our Grants to Green program, which put efficiency and cost savings within reach for nonprofits across the nation. Today, that program is known as GoodUse. Philanthropic investment in GoodUse has multiplied, and its impact has grown to more than 545 projects across 29 states. Annually, GoodUse nonprofits are cumulatively saving 202 million kWh; 1.7 million Therms; 150,000 kGal of water; 139,000 metric tons of CO2e; and \$3.5 million in utility costs.

The Kendeda Fund has also been a major contributor to Southface's core operations and programs. Because of their support, hundreds of communities have become more resilient, and 1.6 million metric tons of carbon emissions have been kept out of Earth's atmosphere. The Kendeda Fund is nearing the end of its philanthropic journey, and Southface is deeply grateful for the continued impact of their legacy. We are committed to carrying this legacy forward by securing new investments and scaling GoodUse's extraordinary impact.
